The clean-up program will come to a close once all eligible works required by registrants are completed.

Meanwhile, the Blanchetown Shack Owners Association are preparing for their "Floody Hell Recovery Party" early next month. This is a great opportunity for the local community to come together and enjoy each other's company. We would also encourage attendees to check in on one another and make sure people are getting the support they need. More details about the event are outlined in this week's newsletter.

Heading over to Mannum, the Disaster Legal Support Program held a floodrelated insurance event in the town and online last week. The event covered a range of matters from cash settlements to understanding your insurance policy. More details, including how you can receive free legal advice, are outlined below.

While registrations will no longer be accepted after 13 October 2023, the cleanup will continue beyond this date. Those who have registered will continue to have their works completed.

#### Update from Johns Lyng Disaster Management Australia

#### **Program Support Registrations Surge**

Following the announcement of registrations closing on 13 October 2023, we have experienced a significant surge in people looking for clean-up support. Our dedicated teams continue to provide support on various aspects of the program, including demolitions, hazard reduction, and the removal of flood-affected waste from both kerbsides and the river.

#### **Progress in Demolitions and Hazard Reduction**

Our efforts in demolitions and hazard reduction are making substantial progress, paving the way for the next phase of recovery. Under the program, we have successfully demolished nearly 70 structures and completed multiple hazard reduction jobs, including the crucial tasks of removing asbestos and treating mould.

#### **Efficient Waste Management**

In our commitment to responsible waste management, we have successfully cleared over 14,000 tonnes of flood-affected waste, diverting 40% of it from ending up in landfill. We have strategically incorporated kerbside collection into other cleanup initiatives, optimising resource usage based on the current demands of the clean-up operations.

#### **Registration Closure Details**

A reminder to all members of the community: registrations for program support will close on 13th October 2023. The program work, however, will continue beyond this date to meet the ongoing clean-up needs. We urge those still awaiting insurance outcomes to register before this date. If you know of anyone yet to register, please encourage them to reach out to us at 1800 302 787 to explore available options and initiate the registration process for clean-up support.

#### **Demolitions and Structural Assessments**

Full demolition support is available to both insured and non-insured registrants. To determine if demolition is recommended for your property and take advantage of this fully funded support, be sure to book your structural assessment promptly.

In light of the increasing number of scheduled demolitions, we are shifting our strategy to complete the work in efficient clusters, ensuring optimal utilisation of program resources.

For those seeking structural assessments, please coordinate with your case manager to schedule this vital assessment, determining the recommended work and enabling you to opt in for demolition or hazard reduction as needed. If you wish to opt in for demolition, kindly contact DMA at 1800 418 491.

#### **River Debris Collection and Structural Assessments**

The river debris cleanup is an historic undertaking in our region and is progressing in two stages. The first stage involves the removal of smaller items, while the second addresses the removal of larger items posing navigational or environmental hazards. Stage one has been successfully concluded ahead of schedule, removing over 5,100 items and totalling over 50 tonnes.

#### Safety along the river these school holidays

With the arrival of the warm weather and school holidays fast approaching, River Murray communities are once again expecting an influx of visitors in the coming weeks.

While this is an exciting time for river goers, safety along the river – for locals and tourists alike - remains our priority.

The clean-up effort - including demolitions, rebuilding activities and the clearing of river debris – will continue over the school holidays, and can potentially pose a hazard to you and your family.

To ensure this important work is performed uninterrupted and without incident, please avoid these worksites as much as possible.

Keep an eye on children in communities where flood-damaged shacks and houses are not fenced. Please do not let them enter flood-damaged buildings.

If you access a road where demolitions or rebuilding activities are underway, drive to the conditions and exercise caution, particularly around workers.

The following precautions are also recommended:

• The hazards associated with riverbank collapse still exist in some areas so be aware of the signs - such as cracked riverbanks and leaning trees, and keep away from fenced or sign-posted affected areas.

• Always wear a personal flotation device on the river.

• Do not jump or dive into the river when you do not know what is below the surface.

• Camp on higher ground away from the river bank.

• Supervise children at all times and do not allow them to play in or near fast-flowing river water.

• If in doubt, stay out.

**Disaster Legal Support Program's insurance session** 

The <u>Disaster Legal Support Program</u> (DLSP), run by Community Justice Services SA, provides free legal help to South Australians impacted or at risk of natural disasters. A <u>"Crash Course in Insurance"</u> session was held on Wednesday 13 September at The Mannum Club and streamed online to discuss flood-related insurance matters.

DLSP Coordinator and Solicitor, Jacqui Nuske presented the course. The session included practical, accessible legal information, including how to read and understand your policy, important things to know about claims and cash settlements, how to negotiate and navigate a dispute with your insurer, and how to to get help and free legal advice.

The Flood Recovery Grant has been extended until 31 December 2023. The Flood Recovery Grant is available to help pay for costs of clean-up and reinstatement of small businesses and not-for-profit organisations that experienced damage as a result of the River Murray flood. Recently the definition of a sole trader small business changed, to those that derive at least 50% of the income from the business.

The Industry Support Grant has been extended until 31 December 2023. The Industry Support Grant is a \$10,000 payment for an eligible business that usually operates in the affected area and has experienced a downturn of 30% or more in revenue over three consecutive months, up to and including April-June 2023. This grant may cover your usual business costs or used to make changes to your business so it can operate effectively post-flood.

Eligibility now includes businesses that have been operational for less than one year, if the business can demonstrate that income received was 30% less than anticipated.

#### Non-Government Organisations (NGO) grants



Funding is available to support non-government and not-for-profit organisations assisting flood-affected communities to recover from the flood event.

Grants of up to \$15,000 can be used towards supervising or training volunteers, purchasing critical supplies and assist with the rapid deployment of crews on the ground to assist with recovery activities.

The first round of NGO recovery grants was announced in February 2023 and round two is now open. If you are an eligible organisation, please view the fund

guidelines and submit your application to help you help others.






